"Blood Centers of California Supports FDA ADVANCE Study Regarding Donation Eligibility Criteria for Gay and Bisexual Men (ADVANCE: "Assessing Donor Variability and New Concepts in Eligibility")

The FDA is re-thinking blood donation eligibility criteria for gay and bisexual men (Men who have Sex with Men, MSM). To initiate this process, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) is funding a pilot study titled "Assessing Donor Variability and New Concepts in Eligibility (ADVANCE)" to collect data from participating gay and bisexual men that will inform next steps in a data-driven approach to modifying MSM eligibility criteria. The national study goal is enrollment by a total of 2000 gay and bisexual men in eight US cities by March 31, 2022; approximately 800 people have enrolled so far.

Vitalant in San Francisco and the American Red Cross in Los Angeles are participating sites with a combined goal of 500-550 enrollments by March 31, 2022.

Blood Centers of California supports ADVANCE because it is a data-focused approach to reevaluating blood donation criteria for gay and bisexual men. These individuals are currently deferred from donating blood if they have had sex with another man within the previous 3 months. This type of deferral, based on the time interval since the occurrence of a risk factor, is referred to as a "time-based deferral" and is not based on individual risk. ADVANCE data and subsequent FDA-sponsored research will help determine whether blood donation eligibility for gay and bisexual men can be based on individual risk, that is, "individual risk-based deferrals," which is a more individual-specific approach.
