#### **Proposed Bylaws amendment:**

Proposed amendment: The legislative Committee reviews, takes positions, or requests amendments that impact the functioning and administration of the member centers. Input is sought from MTAC and national organizations on pertinent issues.

The legislative Committee may take a position on a legislative issue if:

the legislative issues are in keeping with the established goals and objectives to be reviewed each legislative session

the position taken is consistent with approved goals and objectives (policies) and approved bill positions

the positions on legislation shall be approved by the Board via email vote

# Legislative Goals and Objectives – Approved by Legislative Committee 3/19/2021

- 1. Keep BCC informed about legislation that may affect the blood industry, labor issues, non-profit issues, small business and other issues pertinent to the blood supply of California
- a. Objective review legislation and present to Legislative Committee for positions
- 2. Monitor legislation and regulations as identified to affect BCC
  - a. Objective Advocate for or against legislation or regulations as directed
  - b. Objective Suggest amendments as appropriate
  - c. Objective Testify for or against legislation as necessary
- 3. Determine each legislative session if legislative remedies are necessary to assure the adequate supply of blood and blood products in California as well as the effect of other issues on the functioning of blood centers
  - a. Objective Write language for legislation
  - b. Objective Respond to regulations for or against our interests
- 4. Assist the Legislative Committee and Board in proactively identifying policies that have a potential impact on blood and blood products as well as other issues that might impact the business of blood centers
  - a. Objective maintain relationships with groups that share our interests

- b. Objective Assist with the development and implementation of pertinent policy issues affecting blood and blood products
- c. Objective Encourage and assist blood center Directors to be actively involved with their state and federal representatives
- d. Objective Maintain contact with pertinent blood, tissue and organ organizations as necessary

#### **Bill Position Definitions**

**Sponsor** – develops a legislative proposal, seeks author and other interested groups to assure passage of this proposal, we are the principal on this proposal and work diligently for its passage

**Co-Sponsor** - works with one or more groups to develop, introduce and seek passage of a legislative proposal

**Support** - does not introduce the legislation but supports it with - correspondence, testimony, legislative visits, etc.

**Oppose** - gives major emphasis to the defeat of such legislation and works with other groups to do so

**Watch** - will monitor the bill, which may if amended affect BCC. Any significant amendments will be reviewed and brought to committee for review; a position may be taken at a later time.



#### Legislative Report - 2022

#### Budget 2022 - 23

The May revise was submitted by the Governor on May 10th. A balanced budget is due on the Governor's desk on/or before June 15th. Again, this year no Conference Committee, the budget bills are AB 154 (Ting) and SB 154 (Skinner) was discussed Monday, June 13th and voted on. While the \$300 billion budget was submitted to the Governor on time; negotiations continue and the Governor has 12 days to review and sign the budget. The Governor has line item budget but cannot add to the legislative budget. The budget also has reserves of \$37.8 billion which incorporate all the reserve accounts which are the stabilization, economic uncertainty, school stabilization and safety net reserve accounts.

Some of the funding includes:

The Better for Families Rebate Plan which is \$8 billion and includes:

\$200 tax rebate for individuals making less than \$125,000 and joint filers making less than \$250,000

One time cash assistance to SSI/SSP recipients and CalWORKS families This plan covers 90% of the families in California

Workforce funding to address:

Nursing shortages - total funding: \$270 nursing initiative

Small businesses and non-profits

\$250 million for relief grants to employers with up to 150 employees to offset The Paid Sick Leave program – small business and non-profit

\$100 million for COVID Relief Small Business Grants and existing grant Programs

\$870 million – full rebates to cover federal unemployment Insurance costs for employees with first 250 employees for every business

K-12 education – largest funding ever \$128 billion - \$20,000+/student in Governor's budget

#### **COVID** - Testing and Vaccinations in K-12

The positivity rates of COVID are rising across many areas of the state; schools are revisiting their current protocols. The variants are affecting students; current protocols have lessened with no social distancing, no contact tracing and although the mask mandate has been dropped (March 12th), Sacramento City school district has reinstated their mask mandate, will other school districts in the county?

California health officials also plan to expand school-based vaccination at more sites as eligibility continues to grow among younger age groups. Currently, children age 5 and older are eligible to get a COVID-19 vaccine and booster shot. It's unclear whether COVID-19 protocols in K-12 settings will differ between vaccinated and unvaccinated

students in the fall. The state health department highly recommends vaccines for school age children. However, there is no full approval for those as young as 5 years old. The state is not expected to require students to be vaccinated to attend class until July 2023 at the earliest.

The TTD Committee is currently reviewing and updating all AABB's emerging infectious disease fact sheets, first published in 2009, and is releasing the monkeypox virus fact sheet as an interim document.

The TTD Committee continues to monitor developments related to the outbreak and also posted a <u>monkeypox virus outbreak summary</u> on May 27. AABB reminds members that monkeypox is not known to be transfusion-transmitted and there have been no reports of transfusion-transmitted cases.
