- AB 10** (Alejo) **Minimum wage: annual adjustment.**  
**Bill Status:** closed

This bill would increase the minimum wage, on and after January 1, 2014, to not less than \$8.25 per hour. The bill would further increase the minimum wage, on and after January 1, 2015, to not less than \$8.75 per hour, and on and after January 1, 2016, to not less than \$9.25 per hour.

**Summary:**

This bill would authorize a corporation to take actions during an emergency, as defined, to conduct the corporation's ordinary business operations and affairs, as specified, and provide that any action taken in good faith during an emergency under this authorization would bind the corporation and not be a basis to impose liability on a corporate director, officer, employee, or agent. This bill would also authorize a corporation to adopt bylaws to further direct the operations of the corporation during an emergency, as specified.

This bill would state the intent of the Legislature to enact legislation that would promote and pursue programmatic changes to nursing and paramedic licensure requirements for California's military medical personnel in order to recognize the talent, skills, and training of these military medical personnel.

**Summary:**

This measure would designate April 9, 2013, as DMV/Donate Life California Day in the State of California, and April 2013 as DMV/Donate Life California Month in the State of California, and would encourage all Californians to sign up with the Donate Life California Organ and Tissue Donor Registry.

**SB 9** (Price) **State government: social innovation and entrepreneurship.**

**Bill Status:** active

**Last Action:** Mar 27, 2013. Hearing postponed by committee.

**Current Location:** SEN GOVERNANCE AND FINANCE.

**Summary:**

This bill would establish the Office of Social Innovation and Entrepreneurship Development within the Office of the Governor to establish partnerships with government agencies, private investors, nonprofit organizations, and for-profit service providers to facilitate the use of social impact bonds (SIBs), as defined, to address social services needs. The bill would require the office to develop a strategic plan for promoting SIBs, develop model provisions for performance-based contracts, and report annually to the Legislature on the use of SIBs.

**SB 46** (Corbett) **Personal information: privacy.**

This bill would revise certain data elements included within the definition of personal information, by adding certain information that would permit access to an online account.

**SB 249** (Leno) **Public health: health records: confidentiality.**

**Bill Status:** closed

**Last Action:** Oct 1, 2013. Chaptered by Secretary of State. Chapter 445, Statutes of 2013.

**BCC Position:** Watch

- This bill has been amended since it was first tracked. (September 3, 2013)

**Summary:**

This bill would authorize the State Department of Public Health, subject to specified provisions, to share health records involving the diagnosis, care, and treatment of HIV or AIDS related to a beneficiary enrolled in federal Ryan White Act-funded programs who may be eligible for services under the PPACA with participating entities, as defined, in health care coverage expansions under the PPACA.

**SB 400** (Jackson) **Employment protections: victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, or stalking.**

**Bill Status:** closed

**Last Action:** Oct 11, 2013. Chaptered by Secretary of State. Chapter 759, Statutes of 2013.

**Last amended:** Aug 6, 2013.

**BCC Position:** Watch

- This bill's history has recently been updated. (October 11, 2013)
- This bill has been amended since it was first tracked. (August 6, 2013)

**Summary:**

This bill would extend these protections to victims of stalking. The bill would also prohibit an employer from discharging or in any manner discriminating or retaliating against an employee because of the employee's known status as a victim of domestic violence, sexual assault, or stalking, and require the employer to provide reasonable accommodations for such a victim.

**SB 621** (Gaines) **Vehicular air pollution: in-use, diesel-fueled vehicles.**

**Bill Status:** active

**Last Action:** Apr 9, 2013. Set, first hearing. Failed passage in committee. (Ayes 3. Noes 4. Page 487.) Reconsideration granted.

**Last amended:** Apr 2, 2013.

This bill would require the state board to amend a specified regulation relating to the emissions restrictions of diesel particulate matter, oxides of nitrogen, and other criteria pollutants from in-use, diesel-fueled vehicles to extend by 5 years various compliance dates applicable to those vehicles.

**SB 727** (Jackson) **Medical waste: pharmaceutical product stewardship program.**

**Summary:**

This bill would require a producer, individually or jointly with other producers, in consultation with specified entities, to develop a product stewardship plan that includes, among other things, certification that the product stewardship program will accept all unwanted products, except as specified, contact information for the individual or entity submitting the plan and for each producer participating in the program, and a description of the methods by which unwanted products will be collected in the state.

Covered drugs do not include any of the following: Drugs that are biological products, as defined in Section 262 (i) of Title 42 of the United States Code, if the producer already provides a take-back program
