Presentations:

Dr. Philip Norris, Associate Director, Blood Systems Research Institute "Age of Blood, Does it Matter"

- Retrospective studies of the age of blood have mixed results
- Prospective studies of age of blood and clinical outcome are ongoing
- It's possible that aged blood may have patient population-dependent effects
- Not enough information to change blood bank policies

Jun Yoon, Vice President for Corporate Development, Cellerant Therapeutics, Inc "Myeloid Progenitors, an off the shelf cellular therapy"

Cellerant founded in 2003 – Formed with exclusive technologies spun out of Novartis & Stanford – 68 employees (~55 in R&D)

- Developing therapies for unmet medical needs in the treatment of blood cancers and blood related disorders with orphan and accelerated approval paths
- CLT-008 lead program: Up to \$170 million in non-dilutive development contract funds CLT-008 through FDA Approval in three indications
- First-in-class, humanized antibody development candidate targeting unique antigen on AML cancer stem cells
- Developing first-in-class products for unmet medical needs in the treatment of blood cancers and blood related disorders with orphan and accelerated approval paths

"What is Covered California and does it affect blood centers?"

Mandated under ACA – federal law and CA - Perez & Alquist (2010)

- First state to do so
- Provides coverage for individual and small businesses only
- Employers w 50 FTEs or more must provide coverage for workers and dependents
- Minimum coverage must be bronze level
- Don't have to offer coverage but if one employee uses the premium tax credit, then employer pays \$2,000/FTE
- Individuals must have coverage
- Employers with 2-50 employees can use the exchange
- Employers must contribute a minimum amount toward employees' premium and buy coverage through the exchange if they want tax credits

Blood Donors:

- Psychologically predisposed to helping strangers
- Some degree of medical qualification
- Are giving of life-saving blood
- May be interested in donating in other ways
